Stay water wise this summer

With summer here, it's worth thinking about how we use water around the yard. Being water wise is not only good for the environment, but can also help you reduce your water bill.



Simple actions such as mulching to prevent soil drying out, using dry-tolerant plants in your garden and deeply watering your lawn two to three times per week instead of light watering daily can go a long way to reducing your water use.

It's also best avoid major changes to your garden in summer. Disturbing soil can cause loss of moisture resulting in plant stress.

Compounded with heat, this can make it hard for gardens to recover—so hold off on changes until Autumn.

There's also a ban on all customers using of fixed sprinklers between 10am and 5pm which can help you prevent water evaporation lossanother easy way to reduce the amount of water you use.



Glenoak Reservoir

Site works were recently completed, with approximately 4300 cubic meters of earth and rock excavated to create a level surface. This work allows the construction of a 4.5 megalitre reservoir to start. The new reservoir will supply water to Lloyd, Bourkelands and Glenoak.
