Keeping water costs affordable in 2021-22

A typical residential water bill will increase by just \$9 a year, while access charges again remain unchanged.

Riverina Water's financial plan for 2021-22 represents the county council's committment to keeping water costs affordable for the county council's 73.000 residents.

There was also good news for industry, with developer charges frozen and forecast to reduce in the coming years.

"Residents and businesses across

the southern Riverina will continue to benefit from some of the most affordable drinking water charges and fees in the state," Riverina Water CEO Andrew Crakanthorp said.

"Usage charges will increase by a modest 1.8 per cent, while the access charge remains at \$160.

"And by keeping developer costs at a minimum we can foster growth across our supply area."

The advantage of a low, fixed access charge is that customers know the upfront cost and can manage their water usage to have greater control over their bill.
